 - 4. The narrative can be written in either paragraph or bullet format. Regardless of the format chosen, each bullet or sentence should attempt to answer these three questions:
 - a. What was done?*
 - b. How well was it done?*
 - c. What were the results**
- 5. Use the above format for “mission group” nominations*
 - 6. It is important to keep the nomination to the requested 5 pages and in the correct format. A/TA receives multiple submissions and consistency across those nominations helps facilitate scoring.*
